

TennCare Benefit Changes - Effective August 1, 2005
(All children under 21 will have benefit package A (benefits “as medically necessary”)
(“Adults” are age 21 and older)

*Until September 30, 2005, TennCare **will not pay** to “hold” a bed in the nursing home if the enrollee leaves for any reason.

Beginning October 1, 2005, TennCare **will pay for up to 10 days** each year to “hold” a bed in the nursing home if the enrollee must leave the nursing home. Each year, TennCare will start counting on July 1st and stop counting on June 30th. (For fiscal year 05-06, TennCare will still pay for up to 10 days even though it’s only a 9 month period of time.)
